Do I need to have certain qualities/skills to do this subject?

- The ability to work in a group situation and to think independently and creatively
- The ability to meet deadlines
- An excellent attendance record.
- A willingness to use a range of resources for your coursework tasks including practical performances, role play, presentations and ICT programmes.
- Students must accept that due to the nature of the assessments, independent learning will be vitally important.

What will I learn?

- Students will learn about the different care value and apply these to real life scenarios, alongside the development of the human body across Physical, Intellectual, Emotional and Social areas.
- The knowledge, understanding and skills necessary to prepare you for employment within the Health and Social Care sector (employability skills).
- Development of Key Skills of communication, problem solving, observation, working with others and first aid.
- To analyse and evaluate both professional work and the work of your group.

Does this lead to a qualification?

Yes, this is a BTEC qualification which is equal to a single GCSE qualification accredited by the Examination Board Edexcel and Pearson.
