Response to Intervention Resources

Purpose A way of gathering the opinions of pupils within your setting, who have participated in evidence-based or bespoke interventions in order to make informed judgements regarding their impact and effectiveness alongside quantitative assessment data. Response to Intervention Questionnaire Key Stage Two Pupils or Secondary School Pupils

Resources

A questionnaire composed of key questions relating to the context of your school or setting. Multiple choice questions can be included as well as those requiring more detailed responses. Pictures or photographs can be added as prompts or reminders.

Instructions for use:

Pupils can complete the questionnaire independently or within small groups. In some cases, adults may wish to scribe the pupil's responses, or the questionnaire can be presented in an electronic format for the pupils to input their responses. Text to Speech software could also be used so that the questions are spoken to the pupil rather than the pupil having the questions read to them.

The responses pupils provide can be analysed and the information used to inform future practices or strategies used within these interventions. The information may also be used to within reports to Senior Leaders or Governors regarding the effectiveness of specific interventions.
