Resources

An appealing bag containing items that adults feel the child or young person may like and some that they are not sure of e.g. cars, little people, tinfoil, bubble wrap. Try and include items with a range of textures or make noises.

Instructions for use:

The child or young person is presented with the range of objects placed in the bag in turn. It is then recorded which activities they wanted to play with and those that were rejected. This could be supplemented alongside other information such as photographs of the areas of provision children most like to play in etc.

Taking note of the items the child or young person wants to play with will support with identifying motivators for learning and will inform planning for further activities or engaging learning experiences. For example, sorting activities could be based on using the coins with specific letters or numbers on them.

The information gained regarding the pupil's motivators for engaging in learning can also be feed into the review stage of the graduated approach and be included within ISAR reviews, EHC plan reviews or linked to the pupil's Individual Provision Map (IPM).
